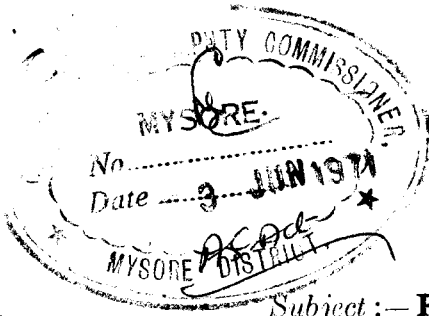

ORDER No. FD 26 SRP (1) 71, DATED, BANGALORE, THE 26TH MAY, 1971

In partial modification of the orders issued in G.O. No. FD 26 SRP (1) 71, dated 1st February 1971, the Government are pleased to order as follows.

2.1. Annexures I and II of the aforesaid Government Order shall, with effect from 1st May 1971, be substituted respectively by Annexures I and II appended hereto.

2.2. The certificates prescribed in paragraph 6 of the aforesaid Government Order shall be discontinued with effect from 1st May 1971.

3.1. If a Government employee, whose basic pay is Rs. 620 p.m. or more and whose spouse is also an employee of the State Government/Central or other State Government/Autonomous public undertaking/Local body/Semi-Government Organisation/Co-operative Society and draws a basic pay of Rs. 620 p.m. or more he/she will be entitled to draw House Rent Allowance, subject to the condition that the other spouse does not draw any house rent allowance. (Since awarded)

3.2. The above restriction shall come into force from 1st May 1971.

3.3. Every Government employee, who is drawing a basic pay of Rs. 620 p.m. or more shall furnish along with his first claim for the allowance (i.e., for May 1971) and also in April each year a certificate in Annexure III. If there is a change in the certificate last furnished, a fresh certificate shall be submitted as soon as the change occurs.

3.4. A Gazetted employee, whose salary is drawn on establishment Pay Bill or a non-Gazetted employee shall furnish the certificate to the Head of the office. A Gazetted employee, whose pay and allowances are subject to authorisation by the Accountant General shall furnish the said certificate to the Audit Officer.

3.5. A certificate in the form given in Annexure IV shall be recorded in April each year by the Drawing Officer on the pay bill in which House Rent allowances of non-Gazetted and Gazetted employees drawing a basic pay of Rs. 620 p.m. or more are drawn by him.

4.1. Paragraph 5 of the aforesaid Government Order shall be substituted and deemed to have been always substituted by the following :—

“ 5. A Government employee shall not be entitled to House Rent allowance if—

- (i) he is allowed Government accommodation free of rent, or
- (ii) he is in receipt of House Rent allowance in lieu of free Government accommodation, provided that where the House Rent allowance to which he is otherwise entitled under these orders is more than that he is in receipt of, he shall be allowed to draw the allowance under these orders.”
