Whereas a draft of the rules further to amend the Karnataka Co-operative Societies Rules, 1960, was published, as required by sub-section(1) of section 129 of the Karnataka Co-operative Societies Act, 1959 (Karnataka Act 11 of 1959) in Notification No. GSR-110 (RDC 88 CLM 80 dt. 11th April 1986) in part IV-2C (i) at pages 1 to 3 of the Extraordinary Gazette dated 12th April 1986, inviting objections or suggestions from all persons likely to be affected thereby on or after a period of fifteen days from the date of publication of the notification ;

And whereas the said Gazette was made available to the public on 12th April 1986 ;

And whereas no objections or suggestions have been received on the said draft;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 129 of the Karnataka -Coop. Societies Act, 1959 (Karnataka Act 11 of 1959), the Government of Karnataka hereby makes the following rules, namely. —

1. Title and commencement. —(1) These rules may be called, the Karnataka Co-operative Societies (Amendment) Rules, 1986.

(2) They shall come into force at once.

2. Amendment of rule 2. In rule 2 of the Karnataka Co-operative Societies Rules, 1960 (hereinafter referred to as the said rules, after clause (a), the following clause shall be inserted namely:

“(aa) ‘‘Audit fee’’ means a fee prescribed under rule 30 of these rules for the audit of accounts of every Co-operative Society”.

(v) When the Post Office is not in account with Treasury/Bank

In places where the Post Offices are not having account either with the Treasury or Bank the Departmental Officers may receive the dues remitted by Postal Orders and Money Orders and will be guided by the normal rules.

These should be treated as cash and accounted for in the Departmental Cash Books.

Bangalore dated the 19th May 1986.

In exercise of the powers conferred by proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Karnataka hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Karnataka Civil Services Rules, namely :—

1. **Title and Commencement** :—(1) These rules may be called the Karnataka Civil Services (Third Amendment) Rules, 1986.

(2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. **Amendment of Rule 53** :—Sub-clause (ii) of clause (b) of rule 53 of Karnataka Civil Services Rules shall be substituted by the following namely :—

“(ii) All leave except extra-ordinary leave taken otherwise than on medical certificate and the periods of deputation out of India shall count for increments in the time scale applicable to the post in which a Government servant was officiating at the time he proceeded on leave or on deputation out of India and would have continued to officiate but for his proceeding on leave or deputation out of India.
